## Missions



### Purpose of CASTeams:

To serve the church family and community through community and global mission projects, caring for and helping others in their group, help with serving lunch and other projects at church.

The Mission Committee met with the First Mates and Navigators of our Care and Share Teams in April, and distributed team guidelines and a calendar chart outlining Mission service projects for the remainder of the year. We also discussed areas in which each CASTeam could 'Share and Care' for members on their team during illnesses and/or emergency situations. Each CASTeam will continue to meet and come to some decisions together on what areas of service they would like to pursue for the remainder of 2016. Many teams had already signed up to help with serving Fellowship lunches and other Mission projects.



CASTeam #1 promoted the Spring Cleaning Project in April and collected over 70 large bags of gently-used clothing and household items which were donated to the Assistance League® of Fullerton's Thrift Shop. The Thrift Shop gives vouchers to the families from the Women's Transitional Living Center (WTLC) and Pathways of Hope so they may shop free of charge for clothing and items they need while living at the various facilities. The April Mission Offering of \$598 will be donated to the WTLC to help them with their program for families transitioning out of abusive situations.

The following projects are scheduled for Spring and Summer:  
May Mission Offering will support UMCOR Disaster Relief for the Earthquake in Ecuador. **International Disaster Response fund (Advance #982450)**

CASTeam #3 will use the Mission offering in June to help H.I.S. House by purchasing supplies for the Transitional Housing of the Homeless in Placentia.

CASTeam #5 is planning on preparing Blessing Bags for the Homeless in July. Mission Funds will be used for the continued support of our Threshold Ministries children, Miao Baoyuan and Liu Yang who live at the Hope House Orphanage in Linjiang China.
