Message from our Pastor John Mark Wang

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

-Matthew 28:18-20 NIV

The pandemic feels like it's finally behind us! (Even though recently some of us are testing positive for Covid.) As more and more of us are getting outside and resuming our pre-pandemic lives I've felt God calling me to connect with



more people. In my devotional time with God I am being reminded of the Great Commission – to go out to the ends of the earth and make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Since the pandemic and navigating our online presence the past couple years, now feels like the right time to form new relationships with others for the sake of the Gospel.

In studying books on evangelism, such as "Faith-Sharing: Dynamic Christian Witnessing by Invitation Revised & Expanded edition," the best approach to sharing the Gospel is by having a long-term mindset built on establishing relationships of trust and support. Other forms of sharing the Gospel like soliciting strangers with tracts or telling them they are doomed because of their sin does not yield genuine commitments to faith in Jesus Christ. Often these people live out faith like the person who builds their house on sand. When the first sign of trouble happens, their faith and trust in God falls out from under them. The most enduring faith in Jesus Christ is shared by intentional love, support, and care in ongoing relationships that last a lifetime.

One of the ways I plan to form new relationships for the sake of the Gospel is through my pick-up basketball group I play in once a week. The group of guys that have been consistently attending the two-hour session each week has provided opportunities for me to get to know them better and learn more about their lives, accomplishments, and struggles. The more we get to know one another the better the chance a faith conversation can form, ultimately leading to an invitation to learning more about Jesus Christ through a church event. This form of faith sharing is a gradual process built on relationships of trust and affinity for one another. In our vastly secular society, people are craving for genuine relationships, and when disciples of Jesus are abiding in the Holy Spirit we can connect others with God. Our relationship with our neighbors is just a foretaste of the eternal relationship we have with our everlasting loving God.

Missions . . . Stacey Loy Wong

The last quarter of the year has been a busy one for Missions! In September, our missions offering (\$595) supported the **Women's Transitional Living Center**. This local nonprofit organization serves survivors of domestic violence and human trafficking.





In honor of **World Communion Sunday**, the missions offering for October went to **UMCOR's US Disaster Response**. We collected \$685 to support the community recovery efforts after the devastation caused by Hurricane Fiona in Puerto Rico and Hurricane Ian in Florida.

For November, Missions held a renal-friendly food drive for the low-income dialysis patients at Satellite Healthcare in Orange. Our own **Cheryl Hasegawa** works there as a social worker, and sees how blessed her patients feel when receiving food bags. She was able to hand out several bags of food which contained cereal, cans of meat, canned vegetables and fruit, a bag of rice or pasta, a snack or treat item, and a bottle of oil. Other food items were placed on a table for patients to take as needed. Our missions committee greatly appreciates having Cheryl serve as our "community representative" as she shares our church's love with her patients.



As the weather turned cooler in December, missions opted to create winter kits for the homeless. We set a goal to create 60 winter kits that will be given to Project Phaino. Each kit will include an adult-sized hat or beanie, scarf, mittens or gloves, an umbrella, socks, hand sanitizer, face masks, shampoo/body wash, chap stick, band aids, and facial tissues. We are currently collecting donation items for this project and we plan to have an assembly party after the Almost-Christmas lunch on Sunday, December 11th.

Our missions committee is thankful for our church family who is always generous in supporting projects to help the needy in our community. We would not be able to bless others without your gift of time, energy and resources.



I, Cheryl, learned that my pride and ambition get in the way. I'm always trying to get so much done each day. When Kevin and I took time to read the book together, it was sooo rewarding, like the best way to share time together. Kevin said his pride and stubbornness keep him from being humbly open to God's voice. He said he keeps bonking his head and needs to learn patience. When he doesn't get an answer from God right away, he



needs to wait and look for what God is saying to him. I loved learning that if we "yield" to God, if we open ourselves to His way, not ours, He gives us freedom and victory and adventure, more than we know!



Stacey loved learning to trust God, that we are on the right path. When we're looking for our purpose in life, we can feel confident that we are on a journey w/ Him, He is guiding us gradually in our daily lives. We can be doing dishes, service projects, and trust that we are where we need to be, instead of trying to second guess if we are in the right place. We can be here now.

Cassie said she wants to break down expectations of what God's plan is. We get stuck on what we want to do, or what we think we need to be doing, like for our careers. If we let it go, and are open to listening, we can see the bigger picture and feel the peace that God's plan is there.

Pastor John is a very active person, and is a people person, an extrovert. He loves being with friends and family. He is working on the discipline of sitting still to hear from God. He wants to learn to be quiet and let God speak.

Judy is seeking a closer relationship with God and is learning to do this through more prayer time, reading the Bible, and quiet time. And having less distractions with TV and radio. She wants to be more patient and remember God has a plan for us in each situation. Whatever that situation is, God has a plan. We need to learn to wait for God's timing. The Holy Spirit is the one who reveals God's plan. Also we learned to be READY, with expectation that God will speak to us if we have focused listening, if we look for Him. We can anticipate with excitement and expectation.

Denise appreciated the reminders that God's Spirit is inside, that we already have access to all the fruits of the Spirit - joy, peace etc. She also liked how Priscilla reminded us that God is the God of today, our past is forgiven. Priscilla emphasized that God wants His wishes known—they're not meant to be hidden. She liked her analogies that hearing from God is often like a traffic signal—God's messages or nudges can feel like a STOP, or PAUSE, or GO—and like GPS; If we're on the right track, we won't hear from God, but we'll hear if we're veering in the wrong direction. We CAN experience many signs if we're going in the right direction. These examples really validated all those experiences in our lives when we feel God's nudges.

Jamie said "I was thankful to get to fellowship with this study group. I felt like I got to know everyone a lot better and it was wonderful to hear everyone's unique perspectives. Personally, one thing that stood out to me in the study was to not put our faith in circumstances, but in Christ who is unchanging. Circumstances and what happens in our everyday lives are always changing, so I want to make it a priority to practice dwelling on God's Word throughout the day to keep me centered. I want to make it more of a goal to read and remember the Word more consistently. Lastly, I learned that I need to lean into compassion, humility, and love in all that

I do, just as Christ has shown by example. By aligning with Christ's actions and virtues, it will allow us to better hear God's voice.

Thank you, God for guiding us. Thank you for your wisdom and love, and the chance to learn from and with each other.

We took advantage of the cool weather in early fall, Oct. 22, 2022, to explore the Coastal Wetlands in our own Newport Ecological Nature Reserve. This 1,000 acre preserve includes a beautiful Interpretive Center, with artifacts, videos and gift store. Nineteen Cornerstone trekkers met to walk a stretch of the north end of the bay, sharing our journey with birders, joggers, bicyclists and horseback riders! We walked along some salt marsh, mudflats and a paved trail.

The bay is protected by high

bluffs along the west side along Irvine Ave. The preserve is like a nursery for fish and migrating birds, where ocean salt water meets fresh water. We saw several turkey vultures overhead and discovered the beautiful Pepper tree, where crushed red pepper comes from? It smelled great. After our hike, we got to meet a resident gopher snake brought out by the park ranger at the center. The scaly skin was very smooth, and he was very tame!



We enjoyed a new eatery called Fishbonz Seafood Grill in Costa

Mesa. Super delicious! Thanks, **Arleen** for introducing it to us! It was super fun chatting with friends and getting to know one another better.
