Message from our Pastor John Mark Wang

Dear Cornerstone UMC Family,

Recently, I had the great pleasure of sharing about the church vision I developed for 2025 after much prayer and reflection with God.

Our theme for this year is for us to be:

"United in Prayer, Empowered for Purpose."



Prayer is so important to help us grow our relationship with God and to know God's will for our lives. It empowers us by quieting our busy minds and allows us to focus on talking with our heavenly Father. The more we pray the deeper our relationship to God will be and we will be less stressed, anxious, and worried. Prayer helps us to be spiritually filled up and energized to be able to manage all of life's challenges. Once we are recharged in spirit, we can then have the strength, energy, and focus to live out our faith more effectively for the glory of God.

The last couple of years after the Covid pandemic, I have had the pleasure of visiting with many families who attend our church. One of the topics I love discussing with our church families is about their desire for the future of Cornerstone UMC. What are their hopes and dreams for our community? The overwhelming response I heard was for our church to grow with more people to build on the legacy of Cornerstone UMC for the glory of God. As I took this into account, I spent time praying to God to make our dream of growing with more people a reality. So here are a few ways I have produced for us to do that:

1. **Google Maps & Yelp Reviews** - One of the most helpful ways we can do outreach is by writing an online review on Google Maps and Yelp to share about why we love our church. 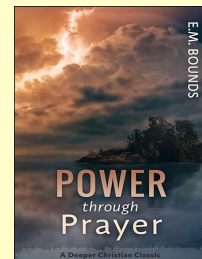


Pastor's Message (contd.)

2. **Prayer Booth** – We will discover our community's needs by setting up a prayer booth for our outreach to meet new people. Praying with a person gives God an open door to touch a person's life. Making a prayer booth service available allows people who want prayer to sit and visit with our volunteers. Prayer booths are an opportunity for evangelism that is not aggressive. Guests expect to talk a little about their spiritual needs while visiting our prayer booth. The prayer booth is an expression of our church's love for the community and lets the community know where Cornerstone UMC is located. Join me if you would like to help with planning and volunteering!

3. **Prayer Book** - I encourage you to read "**Power Through Prayer**" by E.M. Bounds. You can find a copy on Amazon.com.

This book is full of wisdom and will deepen your understanding of prayer and its power. It was written for pastors and preachers, but I have found if you replace those words in the text with "follower of Jesus," it will have just as profound of an impact on you as it did for me. We can do nothing significant apart from God, and developing our understanding of prayer will help us to pray more fervently and commune with God to better our spiritual lives and the lives of others. Each chapter is just 1-3 pages long, and as I read it the Holy Spirit convicts my heart to pray for others with more love and reverence. It will change your perspective on the power and eternal value of prayer.



4. **Meeting New Friends** - Simply put, if we desire to grow with more friends in our church we must meet new people. One of the ways we can do this is by joining a community group outside the church to make new friends. Any hobby or interest you have with others is an opportunity to make new friends, invite people out to lunch, and have fun. I will be joining a local area volleyball group to make new friends and develop new friendships. Once new friendships develop it will be much easier to invite them to church gatherings because we enjoy each other and want to spend more time together. Sharing our faith does not have to be scary, confrontational, or a debate. Rather, a chance to invite someone you care about to enjoy more time together at church where they can meet Jesus.

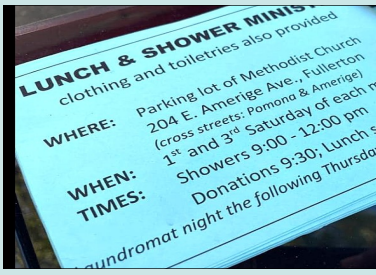
Missions . . . Stacey Loy Wong



The January and February 2025 mission offerings were given to the California-Pacific Conference's Los Angeles Fire Recovery Fund. Through the generosity of our church family, Cornerstone was able to contribute \$2,500 to the Fire Recovery fund, in addition to Target gift cards that were individually donated to assist Altadena UMC members affected by the fires. Ever since the fires devastated the Altadena and Pacific Palisades areas, Cal-Pac's Western Jurisdiction United Methodist Volunteers in Mission have been boots on the ground to help.

The next phase of recovery is crucial and can benefit from continued financial support with either gift cards or cash donations. It's a reminder that even when the initial crisis passes, the road to recovery continues for those affected.

The March mission offering will be used to purchase sack lunch items for the Lunch and Shower Ministry. On the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month in the parking lot of Fullerton First UMC, the Lunch and Shower ministry may host anywhere from 70-100 guests. Sack lunches are provided which contain applesauce or another fruit cup, peanut butter or cheese sandwich crackers, soft granola bars, breakfast fruit bars and trail mix packets. Over the course of a year, that would be over 1,800 sack lunches!

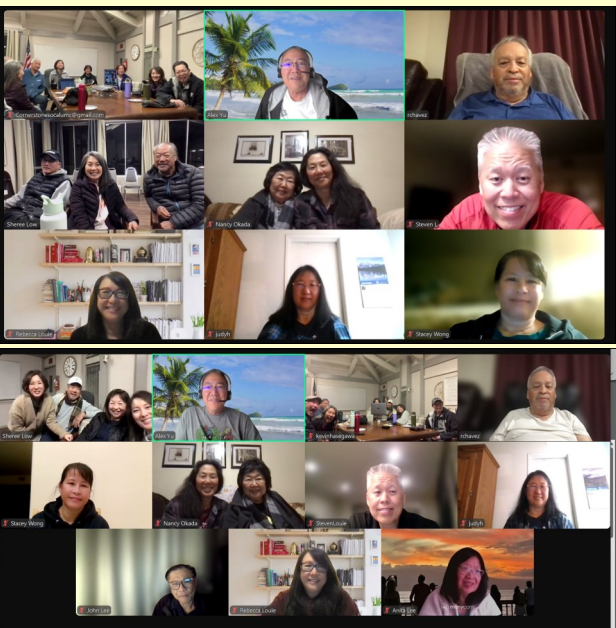

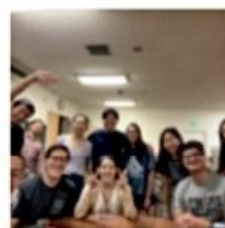

He had such a great time laughing and talking with everyone.



DJ departs in two days for his High School Reunion in Las Vegas. Friends are coming from the Philippines, where he grew up and many other states in the US. He has a nice group of friends who stay in touch. DJ grew up in Las Pinas, Manila, Philippines. He's the eldest of four siblings, so he was the responsible one, helping to raise his youngest brothers (and change their diapers). 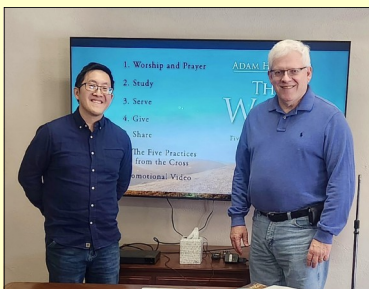

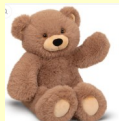

Come to Church to Meet Baby Jordan

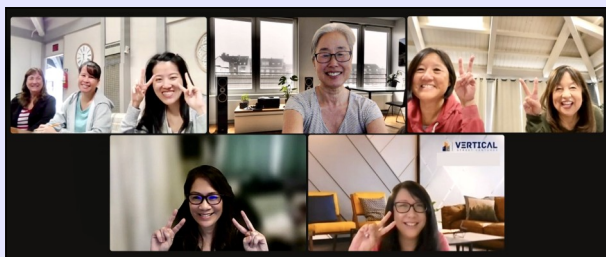


Praise the Lord! Pastor John and Reesy welcomed Baby Jordan, born on September 8, 2024.
